



INFORMATION ON BECOMING A PHARMACIST IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Pharmacists applying for reinstatement in British Columbia.

Here's what you need to do to reinstate as a practicing pharmacist in B.C. Select the criteria which best describes your current status:

- Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for less than 90 days
- Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for 90 days but less than six years
- Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist 6 years or more

Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for less than 90 days

- Step 1** Complete the “Application for Reinstatement – Late Registration Renewal” and pay the fee to transfer to the Full Pharmacist register.

Please allow twenty business days for the College to process your application.

- Step 2** Successfully meet the requirements of the Professional Development and Assessment Program (PDAP), if applicable.

This requirement must be completed prior to becoming eligible to transfer to the full pharmacist register. For more information, please contact the College office.

- Step 3** Pay the Full Pharmacist Registration fee for the year.

Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for 90 days but less than six years

Successfully complete all reinstatement requirements within three years from the time your Application for Reinstatement has been approved.

- Step 1** Complete and submit the “Application for Reinstatement (more than 90 days but less than 6 years”.

Please allow twenty business days for the College to process your application.

- Step 2** Pay the fee to transfer to the Full Pharmacist register.

- Step 3** Successfully meet the requirements of the Professional Development and Assessment Program (PDAP), if applicable.

This requirement must be completed prior to becoming eligible to transfer to the full pharmacist register. For more information, please contact the College office.

- Step 4** Pay the Full Pharmacist Registration fee for the year.



Non-Practising Pharmacist Registration or Former Pharmacist for six years or more

- **Step 1** **Complete and submit the “Application for Reinstatement – 6 years or more”.**

Please allow twenty business days for the College to process your application.

- **Step 2** **Pay the fee to transfer to the Full Pharmacist register.**

- **Step 3** **Successfully complete the Structured Practical Training (SPT) program**

Structured Practical Training program requirements vary depending on how long you have been out of practice.

If you have been out of practice in BC for more than six years you need to complete 500 hours of structured practical training. You may be exempt from this requirement if you can provide evidence of direct patient care pharmacy practice, or equivalent, in Canada or the United States.

You have now completed all the steps necessary to become a pharmacist registered to practise in BC. The College will issue a Certificate of Registration and an Annual Registration Card designed to be carried in your wallet. You will need to renew your registration once a year.
